Here is the scenario.

- 1) can not have a restricted CDL, if he possesses a CDL.
- 2) must upgrade from a class D (car) to a NON-CDL Class B
- 3) must bring in a classified vehicle, that has a GVWR of 26,001 lbs or greater
- 4) \$5.00 fee, and written and road exam
- 5) facility will issue the NON-CDL class B, and gives the applicant the form for the restrictive CDL. They mail the form to Springfield
- 6) Springfield, will issue the restrictive license

Can he go to a regular SOS facility or does he need to go to a CDL facility?

RESTRICTED "CLASS B" CDL:

The Restricted CDL will allow you to drive "Class B" vehicles, which are defined as: any vehicle with a GVWR of 26,001 or more pounds, or any such vehicle towing a vehicle not in excess of 10,000 pounds GVWR and any vehicle of a lessor classification except motor-driven cycles.

HAZARDOUS MATERIALS:

The restricted CDL holder may transport only the following hazardous materials: In Illinois, a driver must be age 18 to transport any type of hazardous materials and age 21 to transport any type of hazardous materials into another state.

- 1,000 gallons or less of diesel fuel
- 3,000 gallons or less of liquid fertilizer
- solid fertilizers that are not mixed with any organic substance

The restricted CDL does not allow the operation of "Class A" vehicles (such as semi tractor/trailer combos) or any vehicles transporting fertilizer mixed with any organic substances, fuel, gasoline, pesticides and propane, or vehicles designed to transport 16 or more passengers.

RENEWAL:

Restricted driving privileges can be renewed without a fee for up to four years from the date of issuance of your first Restricted CDL. A new application is required for each renewal and is limited to 180 days per year.

Safety Checklist For Truck Operation


Demonstrate and discuss with employees the safe operation of the truck.

- Know the truck before operating:
 - a) Parking (hand) Brake
 - b) Headlights
 - Parking Lights
 - Brake Lights
 - Emergency Lights
 - Turn Signals
 - c) Tires
 - d) Horn
 - e) Windshield Wipers
 - f) Rear-Vision Mirrors
 - g) Gear Shift
 - h) Safety Belts
- Be careful when making turns. Trucks require more turning area than cars.
- Allow more time for acceleration when pulling out into traffic.
- Don't tailgate. Trucks require greater stopping distances (at least one vehicle-length for every 10 mph between you and the vehicle ahead of you.)
- Obey weigh-station scale signs.
- Observe truck speed limits.
- Cautiously approach low overhangs such as gas station and motel canopies, bridges, toll booths and drive-throughs.
- Avoid backing the truck. If necessary, have someone guide you.
- Drive and park cautiously on hills.

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS:

To be eligible for the seasonal restricted commercial driver's license, you must meet the following requirements:

- You must be employed by a farm retail outlet and/or supplier, agri-chemical business, custom harvester or livestock feeder. Verification of employment must accompany this application.
- You must have held an operator's license for at least one full year.
- You must have a valid "Class B" Illinois driver's license.
- Your driving record must not contain any of the following within the last two years:
 - 1) Multiple licenses
 - 2) Driver's license suspension, revocation or cancellation of any kind
 - 3) Conviction for driving any type of motor vehicle while under the influence of alcohol or drugs (DUI), leaving the scene of an accident or committing any felony involving a motor vehicle
 - 4) Convictions for serious traffic violations (i.e., speeding at 15 mph or more than the posted limit; reckless driving; improper or erratic lane changes; following too closely)
 - 5) Conviction for accident-related traffic law violation and record of at-fault accidents

LOSS OF PRIVILEGES:

If you are convicted of any of the above violations while operating a commercial motor vehicle after receiving a "Restricted CDL," you will lose your restricted commercial driving privileges through invalidation and/or disqualification action. Periods of disqualification range from two months to life depending on the severity of the offense.
